**Richmond, Va.** – Three day camp programs will be available for children to learn, explore and “Walk a Mile in My Shoes” at The American Civil War Center *at Historic Tredegar*. Kids will experience hands-on activities that describe the lives of women, children, slaves and soldiers during the war. The day camp programs are offered July 10, 31 and August 13. Program fees are \$4 and registration is requested no later than July 1. Space is limited to 20 participants.

Through reproduction items and artifacts featured throughout the Center’s flagship exhibit, *In the Cause of Liberty*, children will learn more about what their lives would have been like in 1860’s America. From the changing roles of women and children on the home front – both slave and free, black and white – to the recruitment of young men into the military, children will take their classroom learning outside and venture throughout the 8.3 acre National Historic Landmark site.
